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# 1 Introduction

Over the recent years, the healthcare sector in Mauritius has risen in prominence. The Government of the Republic of Mauritius has rolled out the National Health Sector Strategy Plan 2020-2024, which spells out initiatives that would position this sector as a value-added segment to the economy. An enabling business environment has also developed over the years with a view to provide a supportive eco system foreconomic players operating in this sector.

An increase in the number of privatehealthcare institutions was observed and future projections indicate that the sector is expected to substantially contribute to GDP and emerge into an economic pillar. The presence of global healthcare players is increasingly contributing to position Mauritius as a competitive high-tech medical hub.

Spending on the healthcare sector amounted to around MUR 26 billion in 2021, representing 5.6% of the country's share of Gross Domestic Product. The sector grew by 4.6% during the corresponding year and on average, net spent in this sector has seen a year-on-year increase of around Rs 800 million. From an investment point of view, a 10-year average estimated at MUR 230 million was recorded.

## 2 Investment Opportunities

The range of investment opportunities in the healthcare and life sciences sector spans over various areas, which encompasses setting up of super specialty hospitals, specialized healthcare facilities such as neurology, orthopaedic, regenerative medicine, oncology, clinical research, geriatrics, sports rehabilitation centers, plastic, and cosmetic reconstructive centres as well as residential care home and nursing homes.

## 3 Incentives

With a view to promote the healthcare sector as a promising economic pillar, the Government of Mauritius has put in place an attractive incentive framework comprising of fiscal and non-fiscal components. The incentives are conferred to the promoter through the issue of either an Investment Certificate or Premium Investment Certificate by the Economic Development Board.

### 3.1 Investment Certificate

An Investment Certificate is issued to companies incorporated after 01 July 2021 and provides the incentives listed in Table 1 below.

Investment Certificate
<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• 8-year income tax holiday on income derived from healthcare, biotechnology and life sciences from year of incorporation</li><li>• Exemption from payment of Registration Duty and Land Transfer Tax for the purchase of immovable property for business purposes</li><li>• Exemption from land conversion tax for the setting up of health institution</li><li>• Payment of VAT on Plant, machinery, and equipment &amp; Construction of purpose-built building and plant and equipment (excluding vehicles) for research and development</li><li>• VAT is zero-rated for provision of healthcare, nursing and residential care services</li><li>• 50% annual allowance on electronic and computer equipment</li><li>• 35% annual allowance on other plant and machinery</li><li>• 5% allowance on capital expenditure incurred on construction/extension of clinic</li><li>• Double deduction to a health institution that become internationally accredited.</li></ul>

### 3.2 Premium Investor Certificate

A Premium Investor Certificate is issued to eligible companies investing more than MUR 500 M in activities which are considered to be as follows:

- i. emerging sectors,
- ii. pioneering industries and first movers,
- iii. innovative technologies and industries.

## Premium Investor Certificate

Holders of a Premium Investor Certificate entitles the project promoter with the following:

Incentives are negotiable and are assessed by a Technical Committee and finalized as approved by the Minister of Finance, Economic Planning and Development.

The incentives may include the following

- rebates, exemptions and preferential rates, in relation to taxes, duties, fees, charges and levies under any enactment;
- facilities, grants and exemptions in relation to -
  - land and buildings;
  - infrastructure and public facilities;
  - utilities; and requirements, including foreign labour.

## 4 Permits and Licences

Private clinics and hospitals are regulated under the Private Health Institution Act and the applicable permits and clearances are issued by the Ministry of Health and Wellness.

### 4.1 Private Health Institution

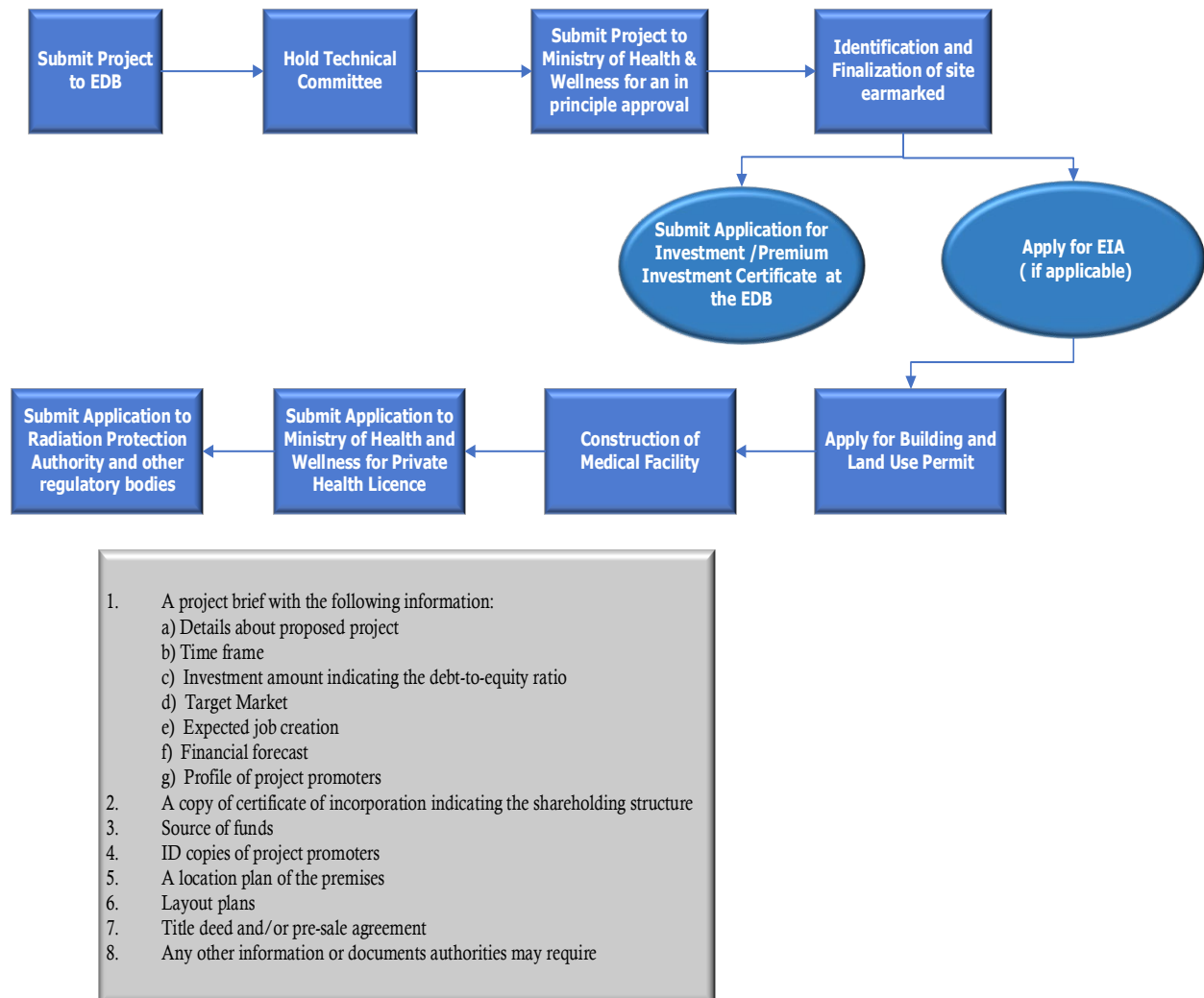


Figure 1: Private Health Institution

## 4.2 Clinical Laboratory

As per the Private Health Institution Act, a 'clinical laboratory' comprises of any premises used or intend to be used to conduct the following activities:

- i) Any type of medical investigation.
- ii) Manufacture, repair or modification of prostheses

A clinical laboratory licence is issued to the private health institution to conduct its activities.

## 4.2.1 Procedure



- (a) Organigram of the laboratory;
- (b) Names and qualifications of staff;
- (c) List of tests carried out;
- (d) Price list;
- (e) List of equipment;
- (f) Statistics for the previous year
- (g) List of tests referred outside with name/s of Referral centres (locally or abroad);
- (h) Waste disposal certificate - including sharps and biological hazards;
- (i) Maintenance contract of main equipment; and
- (j) EQA certificate, if any.

*Director of Private Laboratory should also apply for accreditation to Mauritius Accreditation Service (Mauritas), a department set up under the Ministry of Industry, situated at Air Mauritius Building, Port Louis, as accreditation will be one of the conditions for the renewal of licence.*

Figure 2: Clinical Laboratory licence

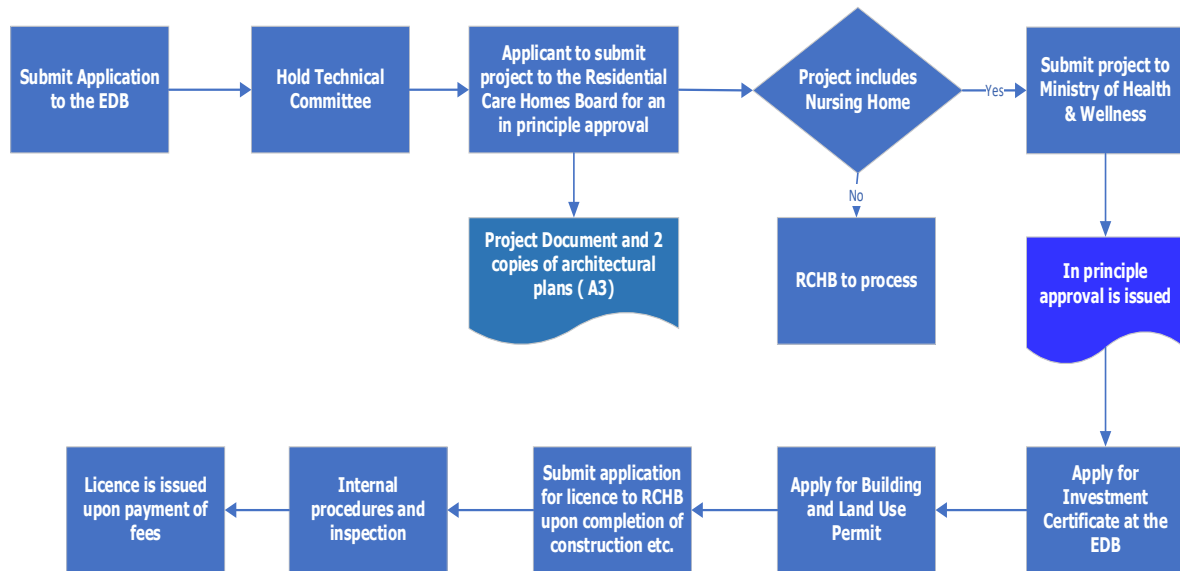


### 4.3 Residential Care / Nursing Home

As per the Private Health Institution Act, a "nursing home" means any premises used or intended to be used for the reception, lodging and care or treatment of any person suffering from any infirmity or convalescing from any sickness or injury, other than a hospital.

The setting up of a residential care home is governed by the Residential Care Homes Act 2003. It comprises the provision of personal care and board to persons who amongst others by reason of old age, disablement, a physical handicap, dependence on alcohol or drugs need personal care and, in some cases, medical treatment.

### 4.3.1 Procedure



#### Documents Required

The application must be accompanied by the following documents:

1. A location plan of the premises
2. A certificate from the sanitary division of the Ministry responsible for health
3. Security clearance from the Commissioner of Police
4. A certificate from the Controller, Fire Services
5. A feasibility study, including evidence of financial viability
6. A Certificate of Character issued by the office of the Director of Public Prosecutions in the name of every person who would be involved in the management of the residential care home
7. The Curriculum Vitae of the proposed manager
8. The list of the staff employed, or the proposed staff to be employed by the residential care home
9. Any other information or documents as the documents as the Board may require

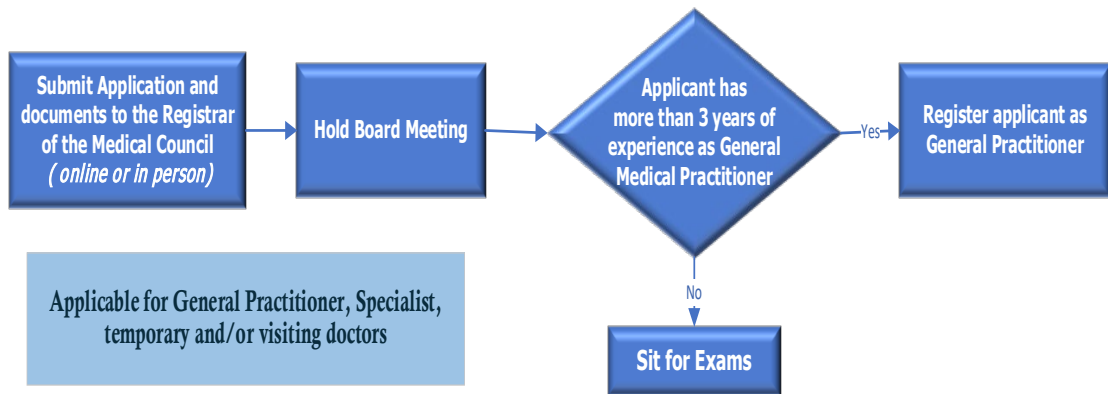

## 6 Registration of medical personnel in Mauritius

### 6.1 Medical Practitioner

#### 6.1.1 Procedure



1. In the case of a general practitioner, the original or certified copy of his diploma in medicine
  2. In the case of a specialist, the original or certified copy of his specialist qualification
  3. Where the document referred in (1) and (2) is written in a language other than in English or French, a certified translation in English or French language of his diploma in medicine or specialist qualification
  4. Evidence of any pre-registration training, where he has completed a pre-registration training
  5. Birth certificate or other acceptable evidence of his identity
- Such other particulars as the Council may require

#### Medical Practitioner

A person may be registered as a medical practitioner if he:

- is a citizen of Mauritius;
- holds the relevant certificates as stipulated by the Medical Council;
- establishes to the satisfaction of the Council that he has undergone not less than 18 months practical (including clinical) training in medicine;
- has successfully undergone an examination for the purpose of determining whether he possesses adequate professional medical knowledge;
- he has paid such fee as may be prescribed.

#### Specialist

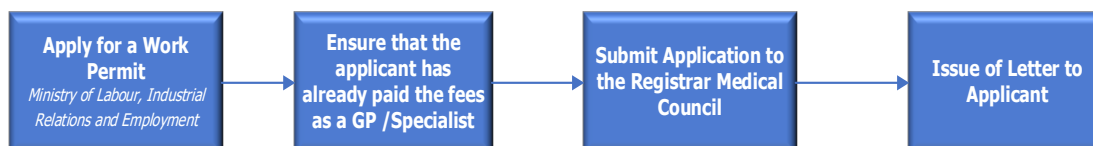
A person may register as a specialist if he –

- is a citizen of Mauritius;
- is registered as a general practitioner in Mauritius;
- holds a specialist which is recognised by the Council acting after consultation
- registered with the Post Graduate Medical Education Board qualification which is recognised by the Council acting after consultation with the Post Graduate Medical Education Board;
- he has paid such fee as may be prescribed by the Council.

## 6.2 Temporary Medical Practitioner

### 6.2.1 Procedure



#### Documents Required

- a) The original copies of his certificates
- b) In case of a specialist the original or certified copy of his certified qualification
- c) Certified translated copies of certificates if in a language other than English or French
- d) Evidence of any pre-registration training, where he has completed a pre-registration training
- e) Birth certificate or other acceptable evidence of identity
- f) Any other particulars required by the Council

- a) Hold a diploma in Medicine or in the case of a graduate who obtained a diploma after studying in 2 or more medical institutions where he:
  - ❖ Establishes to the satisfaction of the Medical Council that he has obtained the relevant modules for the course during the time laid down by the awarding institution
  - ❖ Produces to the Medical Council an exemption or equivalence certificate from the awarding institution
  - ❖ Produces any supplementary information required by the council
- b) Establishes to the satisfaction of the Medical Council that he has undergone not less than 18 months practical (including clinical) training in Medicine.
- c) Has successfully undergone such examination as the Medical Council thinks fit for the purpose of determining whether he possesses adequate professional medical knowledge
- d) Has paid the fees prescribed by the Council as a GP or specialist

## 6.3 Registration of visiting medical practitioners

Visiting medical practitioners shall be allowed to practice in Mauritius subject to:

- a) Being engaged in Mauritius in the implementation of a government scheme agreed by the Government of Mauritius and WHO or some other similar international agency
- b) Visiting Mauritius and has been invited to offer his services under a scheme approved by the Ministry
- c) Visiting Mauritius for the purpose of teaching, research or study in a medical field under such scheme as may be approved by the Government.
- d) Obtaining a work permit from the Ministry of Labour, Industrial Relations, Employment and Training for the specified period limited to the duration of the visit
- e) Being registered with the Medical Council on a temporary basis where the registration will be valid only for the duration of the visit
- f) Pay the fees prescribed by the Medical Council and other institutions

Applications to be registered as a nurse is governed by the Nursing Council Act and should be made in person to the Registrar.

### 6.4.1 Procedure

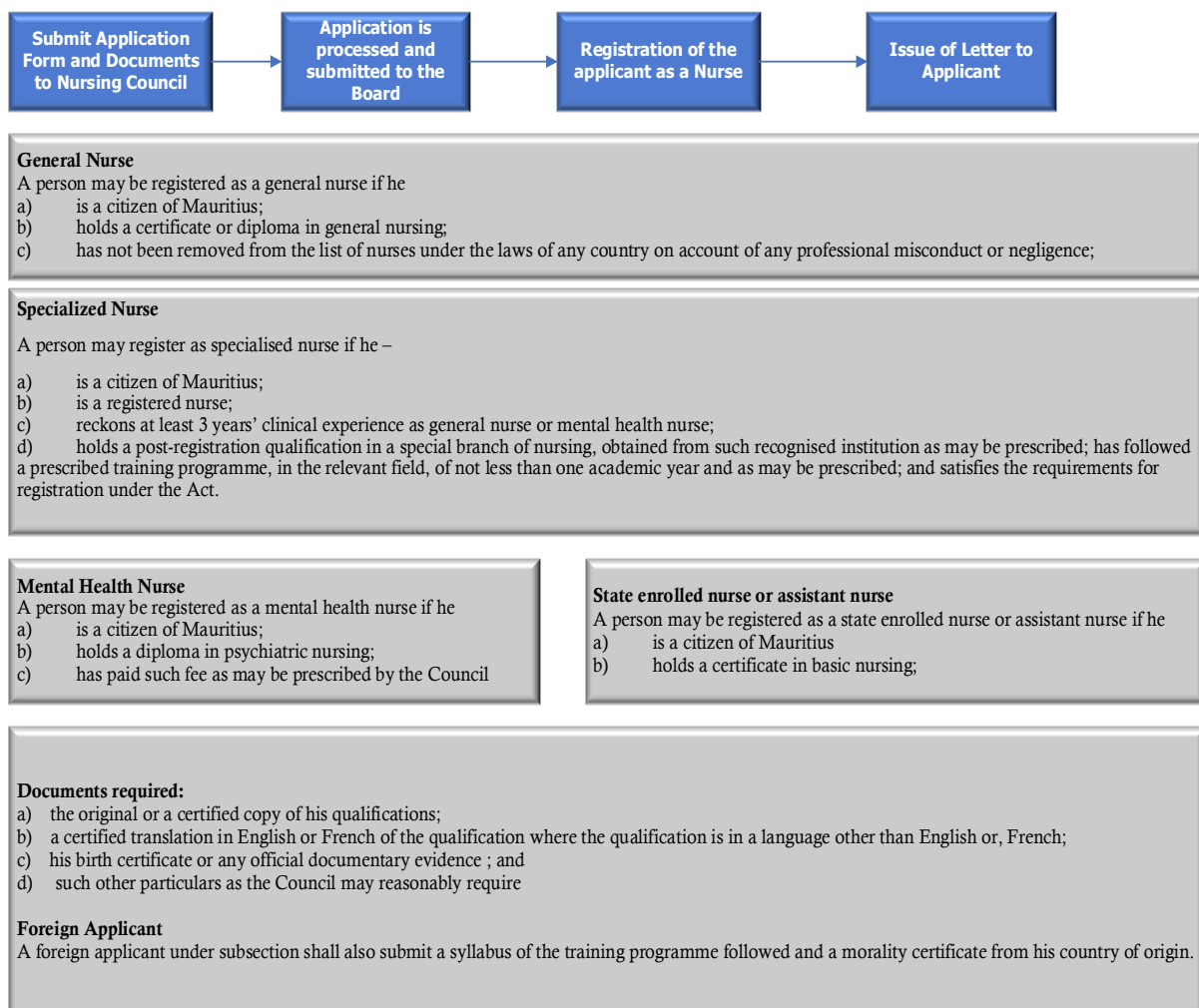
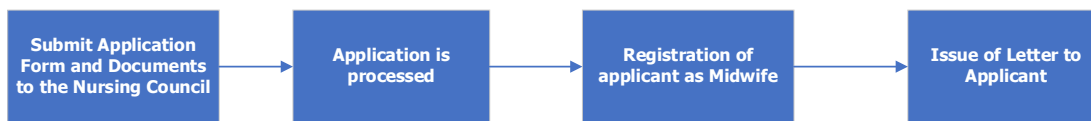


Figure 6: Nurse



## 6.4.2 Midwife



### Midwife

- a) is a citizen of Mauritius;
- b) holds a certificate in midwifery;
- c) is of good character and has not been convicted of any offence involving fraud or other dishonesty;
- d) has not been removed from the list of midwife under the laws of any country on account of any professional misconduct or negligence;
- e) does not suffer from any mental or physical incapacity which may hamper her in the discharge of her duties; and
- f) has paid such fee as may be prescribed by the Council.

## 7 Dental Surgeon and Dental Specialist

As per the Dental Council Act 1999, any person who is a citizen of Mauritius possessing a qualification in dentistry awarded by a recognised medical institution is eligible to be registered as a Dental Surgeon and as a Dental Specialist.

Applications for registration are made either by email or in person in the prescribed application forms which can be downloaded from the links below.

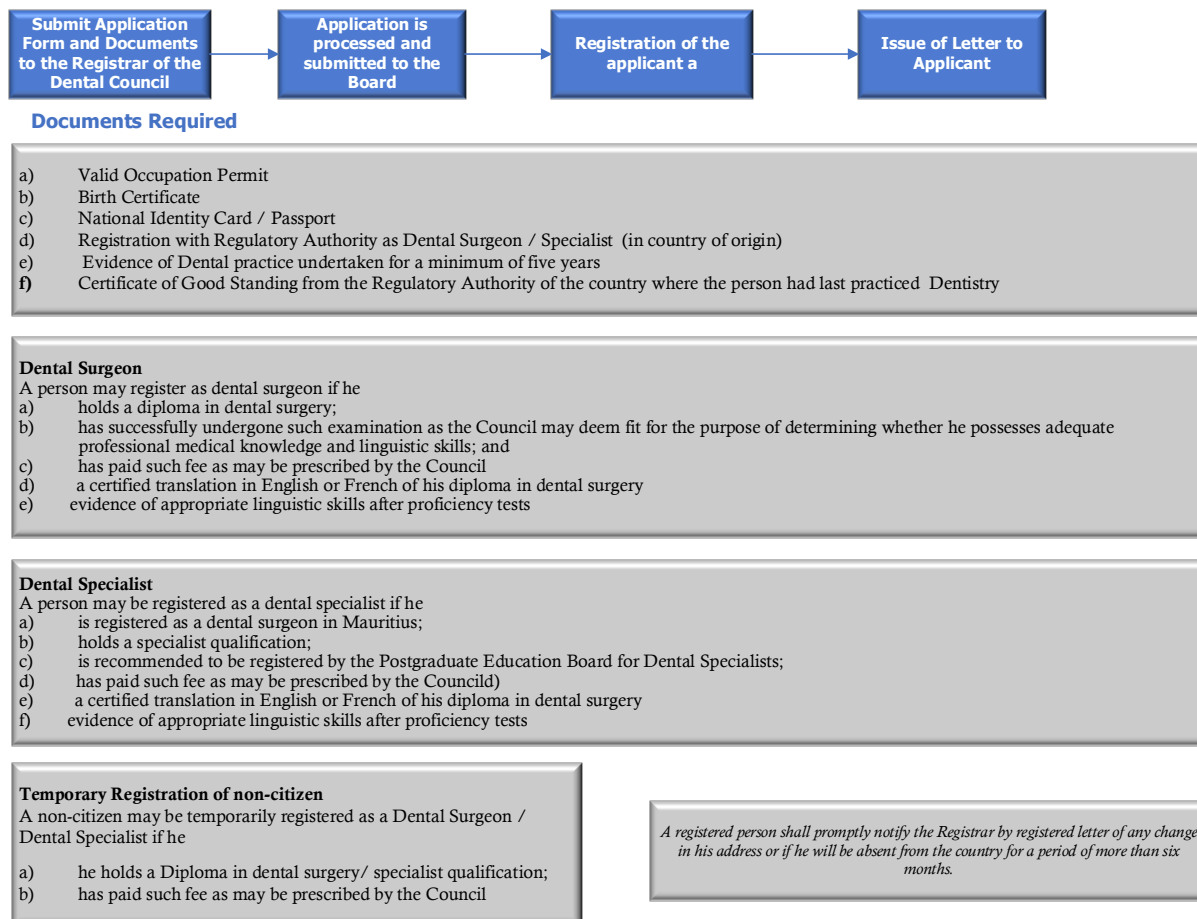


Figure 8: Dental Surgeon / Specialist

## 7.2 Dental Surgeon and Dental Specialist

As per the Dental Council Act 1999, any person who is a citizen of Mauritius possessing a qualification in dentistry awarded by a recognised medical institution is eligible to be registered as a Dental Surgeon and as a Dental Specialist.

Applications for registration are made either by email or in person in the prescribed application forms which can be downloaded from the links below.

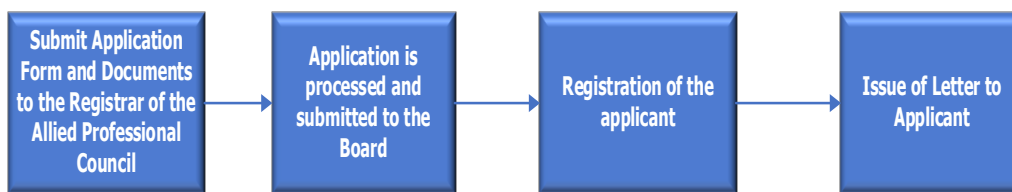

## 7.3 Allied Health Professionals

Under the Allied Health Professionals Council Act 2017, every person who wishes to be registered as an allied professional with the Allied Professional Health Council of Mauritius should apply in person to the Registrar

### 7.3.1 Procedure



#### Documents Required

- Birth certificate, passport or NID or any other acceptable proof of his identity;
- The original or a certified copy of the applicant's degree, diploma or an equivalent qualification;
- Where applicable, a certified translation in English or French of his degree, diploma or equivalent qualification;
- Where applicable, documentary evidence that the applicant's expertise in the allied profession is not available in Mauritius.
- Where applicable, the applicant's work permit, or occupation permit;
- Applicable processing fee;
- Any supplementary document or information required by the Registrar.

#### Allied Professional – Local

- A person may be registered as an allied professional if he:
- is a citizen, or resident of Mauritius;
  - holds the appropriate qualification and experience
  - satisfies the Council that his qualifications are recognised in the country where he has studied, thus providing him with the eligibility to practise in that country
  - pays the prescribed registration fees

#### Temporary Allied Professional – Non Citizen

- A non-citizen may temporarily be registered as an allied professional if he:
- undertakes to work in company or other body where the relevant expertise required in the allied profession is not available in Mauritius;
  - holds a work permit, is exempted from holding a permit under the Non-Citizens (Employment Restriction) Act or holds an occupation permit;
  - holds the appropriate qualifications and experience
  - pays the prescribed registration fees
